

Market & Clayton Street (1) Transportation

Access the major transportation corridor on Market Street, as well as various crosstown bus lines. Take Clayton Street over the hill to reach Cole Valley and Haight Ashbury neighborhoods, or to reach



Golden Gate Park.

Tank Hill **Parks and Recreation**

Valencia Street Corridor **Shopping and Dining**

Famous throughout the city for its trendsetting dining, fashion, and nightlife, this retail corridor is a delight for window shoppers and foodies alike. Some highlights include Tartine, Señor Sisig,



and Dandelion Chocolate.



Mt. Sutro Open Reserve Parks and Recreation

This vibrant, 61-acre open space reserve is nestled amongst the trees, offering more than 5 miles of public, multi-use trails that cater year-round to hikers, trail runners, dogs on leashes, and cyclists. It feels like a little slice of heaven in the middle of the city.



Rikki Streicher Field Parks and Recreation

This popular park and gathering spot contains a softball diamond, a large green space, and outdoor tennis courts. The ever-popular Eureka Valley Dog Run is also directly adjacent.



Corona Heights Park Parks and Recreation

This beautiful hilltop park includes a dog run, and jaw-dropping 360-degree city views over downtown, Castro, Mission, and East Bay Hills.



24th Street Retail Corridor **Shopping and Dining**
